Nashville MTA launches real-time bus arrival displays downtown *Pilot project aims to simplify access to bus arrival, detour information at busy stops*

NASHVILLE – Starting this month, select bus stops along the Music City Circuit in downtown Nashville will have digital, real-time bus arrival displays to show riders when the next bus is due to arrive.

These signs are part of a pilot program to test the feasibility of a more widespread system of real-time bus information throughout Nashville and Davidson County. In helping riders to move smarter, we aim to make it easier for new residents, visitors, or for those simply unfamiliar with public transit to use it.

The signs will have times for the Music City Circuit, any intersecting or overlapping routes, as well as additional information such as a construction detour or fun facts about the Nashville MTA. These signs will allow anyone, regardless of whether or not they have a smartphone or internet capabilities at hand, to access real-time bus arrival and detour information to plan their trips on transit.

Locations of digital bus arrival displays:

- 4th & Union (Stop #4661) - serving routes 15, 18, 36, 60, and 61
- 5th & Music City Central Plaza (#4654) serving routes 60 and 61
- Jefferson St & Dr. DB Todd (#1230) serving route 60 near Fisk University

Customers will have an opportunity to provide feedback during the 90-day pilot via a survey available online and administered at the pilot stops. Surveyors will be out and about to gather feedback in the coming weeks.
